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

Nonday October 7 or 14

rrive at the Kimberly Hotel, which nade Condé Nast's Traveler Gold ist 2013. In the heart of Anhattan it provides immediate ccess to Rockefeller Center, Grand Central, the theater district, and ome of the world's most popular nuseums and restaurants. We'll ather this evening for a welcome linner at an exceptional neighborlood restaurant, where you'll meet ew and old friends, and toast the start of our cultural adventure.

Tuesday, October 8 or 15

Join us this morning at the hotel for our first roundtable discussion. Oxy Professor Alan Freeman '66 will moderate a discussion with a New York theater critic, who will give us a helpful overview of the shows we'll see this week. This afternoon let's take in an exceptional exhibit – perhaps at the MET, MoMA or the Asia Society Museum, among others. Tonight we'll see our first Broadway show, and our evening ends with a post-performance discussion (wine included) in a private room on the Kimberly's romantic rooftop lounge, moderated by Professor Freeman.

Wednesday, October 9 or 16

Our roundtable discussion today may be with up-and-coming, working New York actors – how they survive and thrive – moderated by Alan Freeman. The afternoon is ree for you to explore the Big Apple. This evening we enjoy our econd Broadway show, followed by post-performance discussion at he hotel.

Fhursday, October 10 or 17

Alan Freeman will moderate a discussion with a leading member - actor, writer, or director - from one the shows on our itinerary. In the afternoon we'll take a private, walking tour of several of the best

galleries in Chelsea, a neighborhood of Manhattan that has become the world's center for contemporary art. You'll see the works of up-and-comers, blockbuster exhibitions from art celebrities, and a slew of provocative work. Tonight we'll attend a must-see Off Broadway show, at a venue with a reputation for producing exciting premieres such as the Public Theatre or St. Ann's Warehouse, or for outstanding revivals such as the Irish Repertory Theatre, Postperformance discussion at hotel.

Friday, October 11 or 18

This morning Alan Freeman will moderate another thought-provoking roundtable discussion with working New York theater artists. Tonight we see our third Broadway show followed by our post-performance chat.

Saturday, October 12 or 19

In the morning we travel to Brooklyn for a private tour of the Green-Wood Cemetery. A National Historic Landmark and often compared with the Perè-Lachaise in Paris, this beautiful urban oasis has many of NY's greatest stories to tell (from George Washington and the Battle of Brooklyn to the Civil War). It is the burial site of Jean-Michel Basquiat, Leonard Bernstein, Boss Tweed, Samuel Moss, and Louis Comfort Tiffany, among many other NY luminaries. Your afternoon is free, and this evening we'll see another outstanding Off-Broadway premiere at Playwrights Horizons, followed by a post-performance discussion moderated by the theater's Artistic Director, Tim Sanford '75.

Sunday, October 13 or 20

This morning we'll do a critical wrap-up of the shows we've seen. moderated by Alan Freeman. Then we'll take in a Broadway matinee. After the show we'll have a festive farewell dinner at another exceptional restaurant and say goodbye in style.

Monday, October 14 or 21

Today you journey back home, or arrive for your week-long cultural adventure.

Cancellation and Refunds

All cancellations must be submitted in writing to Insider Cultural Tours. and are subject to 50% of deposit (\$500) to cover administrative costs and handling regardless of reason for cancellation. If cancellation is within 91 days of departure, it may result in additional fees, to cover liquated damages, penalties, and attrition costs incurred by Insider Cultural Tours on your behalf. Cancellation on the day of departure refund for unused portions of tour. including, but not limited to, missed meals, hotel nights, and sightseeing.
